Pope Francis appoint Fr. Donal Roche as Auxiliary Bishop of the Archdiocese of Dublin

Born and raised in Drimnagh, Dublin 12, Fr. Donal Roche attended both primary and secondary school at Drimnagh Castle.

Fr. Donal Roche comes from a family of seven children. He worked as a clerical officer in Dublin County Council before entering Clonliffe College in 1980 to study



for the priesthood. He was ordained in 1986. After 19 years' involvement in religious education, he remains interested in the evangelisation of young people and has an active involvement in sacramental preparation programmes. He has also served as assistant vocations director in Dublin diocese and has served mass on several occasions in the Social Service Centre in Walkinstown through his association with Sr. Anthony. As Auxiliary Bishop of Dublin, Fr. Donal will work closely with Archbishop Diarmuid Martin to support the spiritual and pastoral needs of the local community. He will be responsible for overseeing various aspects of the diocese, including education, healthcare, and social outreach programs.

We congratulate Fr. Donal Roche on his appointment as Auxiliary Bishop of Dublin and wish him all the best in his new role. We pray that he may continue to bring hope and joy to those he encounters in his pastoral work, and that the Holy Spirit may guide him in his mission to support the spiritual and pastoral needs of the local community.



The Dignity and Worth of Women

We all agree that women and men are profoundly equal at the level of personhood, entitled to equal respect and dignity. But Pope Francis says that this is so only in theory; it does not play out in practice. His prayer intention for April is:

That the dignity and worth of women be recognized throughout the world. Our Holy Father points out, and we know ourselves from news reports, that there are many places where women are denied access to aid, education, business opportunities, and are restricted in movement and in dress. Efforts are continuing to eliminate the practice of female genital mutilation. So, what would playing it out in practice actually look like? The Pope wants us to listen to the voice of women. We should talk to each other and listen without preconceptions and then act in whatever way we can in the personal interactions of our own lives to recognise and promote the dignity and worth of women, here and everywhere.

Let us pray that the dignity and worth of women be recognized in every culture, and for an end to the discrimination they face in various parts of the world.
